


## PERFORMANCE NOTES In general the director should conduct groups of dotted half notes and half notes, depending on the stresses in each measure. For example, in meas. 1-3, conduct dots, in meas. 4 dodd, in meas. 5 dodd, in meas. 6 dodd, etc. In meas. 43-55, conduct dots.

\*\*C3 may be plucked as a quarter note on weak beats for greater clarity.

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
