I wrote this text in England after visiting William Carey's home church and part of his old home which the church has preserved as a museum. I had heard about William Carey, the first Baptist missionary, all my life as a little girl growing up in a Baptist church. But to sit in pews hundreds of years old, in a church building hundreds of years old, and to hear present-day members of Carey's church tell his story in great detail and with such enthusiasm was truly inspiring! I found his story especially inspiring because he was a man of very humble means with no particularly outstanding talents, yet he was determined to be obedient to God's call in his life.

Carey's life motto was this: "Expect great things from God. Attempt great things for God." They were more than mere words to him. They were a way of life. Poor Carey didn't even make it into "preaching" school on his first try. They said he was too bad! But he didn't give up. He later struggled with his calling to missions. But once he decided he must obey God's call, he had the monumental task of raising funds to take his family to India. He was determined, however, and his diligence led to a Christian influence in India that still exists today. How great it would be if we were all so determined to share God's good news!
